Inner Work for Retirement: Shifting from Role to Soul Online Lecture: Friday, November 11, 2022, from 7 p.m.–9 p.m.

If we choose the path inward during this transition and attune to the soul's longings, we can uncover the spiritual promise available to us—an identity that thrives beyond the success measured by A Reader's Guide to J. R. R. Tolkien's The Lord of the Rings. productivity and outward achievement. Instead, we can shift from role to soul, to meaning beyond doing, from the frantic strivings of ego to the Noble Elder archetype.



Connie Zweig, Ph.D., is a retired therapist and coauthor of Meeting the Shadow and Romancing the Shadow, author of *Meeting the Shadow of Spirituality* and a novel, A Moth to the Flame: The Life of Sufi Poet Rumi. Her new bestselling book, *The Inner Work of Age: Shifting from Role to Soul*, extends her work on the Shadow into midlife and beyond and explores aging as a spiritual practice. It won the 2022 Gold Nautilus award, the 2021

JANUARY Dr. Becca Tarnas

The Synchronicity of the Two Red Books: Juna, Tolkien and the Imaginal Realm Opening Reception: Friday, January 13, 2023, from 6 p.m.-7 p.m. Lecture: Friday, January 13, 2023, from 7 p.m.–9 p.m.

In the years leading up to the Great War, both C. G. Jung and J.R.R. Tolkien independently began to undergo profound imaginal experiences. Jung recorded these fantasies in a large red manuscript that he named Liber Novus, referred to simply as The Red Book. For Tolkien, this imaginal journey revealed to him the world of Middle-Earth, whose stories and myths eventually led to the writing of *The Lord of the Rings*, a book he named within its own imaginal history, *The Red Book of Westmarch*. This lecture explores the many synchronistic parallels between Jung's and Tolkien's "Red Books": the style and content of their works of art, the narrative descriptions and scenes in their texts, the nature of their visions and dreams, and an underlying similarity in worldview that emerged from their experiences. The two men seem to have been simultaneously treading parallel paths through the imaginal realm.

Jung's Red Book and Active Imagination Workshop: Saturday, January 14, 2023, from 9 a.m.– 1 p.m.

In this workshop, participants will dive deeply into exploring the meaning of certain key visions and fantasies in C. G. Jung's *Red Book*, interpreting the text and images in communal dialogue. The core of the workshop will be a guided group practice of active imagination, followed by a writing and drawing exercise that will allow participants to come into an objective relationship with the images that arise during the practice.

Becca Tarnas, Ph.D., is a scholar, artist and Editor of *Archai: The Journal of Archetypal Cosmology.* She received her doctorate in Philosophy and Religion from the California Institute of Integral Studies (CIIS), with her dissertation titled The Back of Beyond: The Red Books of C. G. Jung and J.R.R. Tolkien. Her research interests include depth psychology, archetypal studies, literature, philosophy and the ecological imagination. She teaches at both Pacifica



Graduate Institute and CIIS and is the author of the book Journey to the Imaginal Realm:

FEBRUARY

Dr. Joseph Cambray

The Psychoid Imagination: Ecology, Artistic Intuition and Enchantment Lecture: Friday, February 17, 2023, from 7 p.m.–9 p.m.

Our journey will begin with a review of key Jungian concepts-archetypes and synchronicity—through the lens of complexity theory, which was developed in the late 20th century. The role of the psychoid layer of archetypal reality will be explored from this vantage point and applied first to recent research in ecological systems. We will look at examples from the history of culture, where artisans and artists were able to represent profound insights into complex natural phenomena well ahead of any scientific understanding. They will guide us toward the articulation of the psychoid imagination, a noetic aift of the soul that can help re-enchant the world. Audiovisual materials will aid participants in entering these experiences.

Opening the Imagination through Wonder Toward Re-enchantment Workshop: Saturday, February 18, 2023, from 9 a.m.– 1 p.m.

The capacity for wonder can open and heighten our imaginal senses. In this workshop, we will weave our way through ideas and experiences of wonder and the feeling of enchantment. Participants will have opportunities to experience and discuss their own history of discovering wonder and ways to enhance it in their lives. This will be framed against a cultural background of disenchantment and how the last several years may be pointing to a way through this desolate and soulless aspect of our culture.



Joseph Cambray, Ph.D., is the Past President and CEO of Pacifica Graduate Institute and Past President of the International Association for Analytical Psychology. He served as the U.S. Editor for The Journal of Analytical Psychology and is on various editorial boards. He was a faculty member at Harvard Medical School, Department of Psychiatry, at Massachusetts General Hospital, Center for Psychoanalytic Studies, and former President of the

C. G. Jung Institute of Boston. Dr. Cambray is a Jungian analyst now living in the Santa Barbara area of California. His many publications include the book based on his Fay Lectures: Synchronicity: Nature and Psyche in an Interconnected Universe.

For C. G. Jung, emotions are the agents of our dreams, the actors in our symptoms the movers of our ambitions, the clicks in our matches, the thud of our dismays and disappointments. Emotion is at the core and reach of human encounters.

Carl Jung stated that "image is alive"-carrying not only symbolic information, but dynamic forces and potential energies for life. Images from dreams, imagination, Emotions emerge in all aspects of our social, cultural and spiritual beings. They emerge fantasy and intuition are the languages of the unconscious, and we can learn to value these happenings, which are routinely dismissed by modern culture as "nothing but through our actions, reflections and connections, our attractions and repulsions.
